Wednesday 19 th September 2012	An Outing Into The Wilderness.
Metsäkartano 08.00-17.00	No, this does not refer to some of the hectic meetings we had during the previous days. It was a day full of activities organized by our Finnish host.
	The organization was perfect. How they managed to get such lovely weather despite the bad forecasts will forever remain a secret. Maybe it has something to do with that clock they have and use I honestly do not know.
	In a good mood we boarded the bus which took us to the wilderness at Metsäkartano, some 100 kilometers north of Kuopio. It was extremely silent presumably caused by the late hard working night activities of quite a few participants. During our bus ride we passed some idyllic villages with unpronounceable names (I really pity dyslectic people in Finland).
	When we finally arrived, the sun was shining and we were all very cheerful. After the campfire coffee, the train family was divided into six groups each of about sixteen persons and ready to face even the deadliest encounters with moose, wolves and bears. Fortunately, the activities proved to be less strenuous and dangerous than we had thought: summer curling, archery, forest golf, rowing slalom, wilderness skills and orienteering among marsh tea.

	How different were things in the final group activity. The instructions were simple and clear: build a line of pine cones and make it as long as possible. Fortunately, this primary behaviour was only visible in this stage of the project week and did not have any effect on the work lines later on.
	We had just finished our activities and boarded the bus when Pluvius opened the floodgates and rain came falling down. The Finnish organization even controlled that part of the outing!
