Temperature outside is +5 degrees C, as on Saturday it was +27. Three busses picked us up at the hotel “Storman”. The Train Family visited Lipica Stud Farm, had lunch in the restaurant, visited famous Postojna Cave and Ljubljana, the capital of Slovenia.</p> <p>The Lipica Stud Farm, one of the most beautiful cultural-historical monuments in Slovenia, is home to almost 400 Lipizzaner horses. With a tradition of over 400 years, it is the oldest stud farm in the world breeding horses uninterruptedly since its establishment. Lipica is a location that ensures optimum conditions of Lipizzaner horses. It has developed its own Classical Riding School with breathtaking elements in the air and on the ground performing all over the world. <b>For more info see: <a href="http://www.lipica.org">www.lipica.org</a></b></p> <p>After lunch in Lipica Stud Farm we moved towards the Postojna Cave. It is the only cave where you can take a special train and ride under magnificent underground arches with stalactites landscape filled with playful limestone sculptures. The enchanting halls take your breath away and the thrillingly narrow tunnels raise your heart rate. The Postojna Cave is the home of almost 100 species of underground animals. The most fascinating among them can be seen in the Proteus Cave-Vivarium. We were taken to the city centre and had two hours of free time. Ljubljana, the capital of Slovenia, is a city in the centre of Slovenia on the Ljubljanica river.
